Even though it makes me crazy that some stores want to be open Thanksgiving night to take peoples Christmas money I am even happier that some stores who tried it last year have closed this year.

In these challenging times, it can seem difficult at times to find things to be grateful for. Therefore, here is my annual invitation for you to participate in one of my more meaningful Thanksgiving practices. Every year, some time around Thanksgiving I write a list of 4-6 things that I am TRULY grateful for (I'm not talking about grateful for chocolate ice cream grateful, though I am, but TRULY grateful). As a side note, if you can only think of one or two- think harder, if you want to write 20-30, then think harder and prioritize the top 4-6. Then I put the list somewhere I can see it regularly, on the refrigerator, near the computer monitor, bathroom mirror, you get the idea, as a reminder. Sometimes when life gets challenging, it can be easy to forget. It is helpful for me to have a little written reminder of God's many blessings in my life.

If you are one who finds themselves bubbling over with gratitude, or at least have some sense of it. I encourage you to lend a hand, write a note, make a call or drop an email to someone who you know who could use a little reminder that one of lives blessings is that we have people in our life that simply care. The Hebrew term for gratitude literally means "recognizing the good". Practicing gratitude recognizes the good that is already yours.




#### **Military Prayer List**



### **Community Service**



For 2017, we can no longer provide toothpaste (all that is collected will go to Kids in Distress and local shelters), toy guns or army men, paint sets and glue bottles.


If you are not a shopper, you can still donate to this worthy cause by providing a cash donation or **monies to cover the \$9.00 mailing costs**.
