This is generated from the loose change collected the first Sunday of each month. Please empty your pockets and change purses that day to meet the needs of our church and community.




## Spiritual Growth Ministry

We can no longer provide toothpaste, toy guns or army men, paint sets and glue bottles.


If you are not a shopper, you can still donate to this worthy cause by providing a cash donation or monies to cover the \$9.00 mailing costs.
