News from Pastor Ken



Well, generally this time of year we are all talking about winter fatigue. However this year, our attention seems focused on more challenging things such as the health of family, friends and our communities. We are concerned about our physical, emotional and financial welfare in a world that seems full of uncertainty.

It is in these times that I am reminded that we are called to function in faith rather than fear. Living in faith does not mean living without fear. Living in faith rather than fear in faith allows us to function and live through or fear. Let's be clear, that is not a statement encouraging reclus living. In fact, quite the opposite, living in faith requires a live of spiritual and social responsibility, loving our neighbors as God loves us and loving God with all our heart, mind and spirit.

Many of you have inquired about why the date of Easter varies every year. We have had both earlier and later Easters. Well here is how it was decided. We can thank our Pagan friends in part for this. In 325CE the Council of Nicaea established that **Easter** would be held on the first Sunday after the first full moon occurring on or after the vernal equinox. From that point forward, the **Easter** date depended on the ecclesiastical approximation of March 21 for the vernal equinox.

Here is what I know for sure. Whether it feels like it or not, Spring and Easter are here. I saw a couple robins the other day and a couple little green sprouts poking up through the winter mud as I walked through my gardens. It must be spring!!

As we finish this Lenten season the end of March and enter Easter, remember it is just like the transition from winter into spring. During what seems to be the endless cold dark days of winter, we start to experience the new life that rises up from what we once were sure was dead.

That is what the Easter season offers us as well, to seek and experience new life, new life in our congregation and new life for ourselves.

This Lenten season was a powerful season for me as I hope it was for you, filled with reflection, preparation and discernment. We spent time this Lenten season considering our own personal journey through the wilderness into Jerusalem. We prayed about what we bring to the cross and more importantly, what resurrection and transformation we have come to expect in our own lives this Easter. Over the past weeks, we have been talking about discovering the Christ within us, to be the resurrected, living Jesus we know God has called us to be.

As we come into spring, expect the miracle of new life. Expect to be transformed. Again, that is what Easter is all about. Some miracles are large, and some are small, some require that we look for them. A number of them even require that we work to reveal them. However, if we do look, if we keep expecting them and are willing to do what God asks us to do; those miracles will just keep coming.

I am excited about what this Easter season has in store for us all, personally and as a community in Christ. I encourage you to keep your heart, mind and spirit open. Let us plan together, pray together, and work together. Let us prepare to be transformed.

I invite you all to participate in the Holy week services including Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, the Great Easter Eve Vigil and of course Easter morning Communion service. Invite those you have missed to join us and share in this time of personal transformation and renewal.

Current needs are as follows:

Girls size 10-12 and 14-16 underwear. Girls socks size 6-10 and 10-4, Boys size 4-5 and 10-12 underwear, Boys socks 3-9. Infant socks Boys & Girls. Women's underwear size 5, 6, and 7 for teenage girls. Baby onesies boys & girls all sizes, baby wipes, shampoo & conditioner

To put into perspective the impact KIDS has on the community, in 2018 they distributed... 4,611 baby outfits, 1,766 coats, 3,723 pairs of shoes, 9.605 socks, and underwear, 18.249 shirts and 14,417 pants.

KIDS also collect's overly worn with holes or stains and sells them to a recycle company. With the money they raise it allows them to purchase items that are needed and helps keep the washer and dryers running to do laundry for the children they serve.


