It just seems that everyone I talk to lately is just really ready for spring to happen. Most are not complaining about how mild this winter has been, me included, but the multiple bouts of spring like weather have us all hypersensitive to the possibility of the change of seasons.

Many of you have commented or inquired about Easter being early this year. Not really. It just came rather late last year. We have had both earlier and later Easters. Well here is how it was decided. We can thank our Pagan friends in part for this. In 325CE the Council of Nicaea established that Easter would be held on the first Sunday after the first full moon occurring on or after the vernal equinox. From that point forward, the Easter date depended on the ecclesiastical approximation of March 21 for the vernal equinox.

Here is what I know for sure. Spring and Easter are here even though it may not feel like spring at this moment. I heard a couple church folks discussing which birds have already shown up and what plants are budding and sending pictures of crocuses. I noticed little green sprouts popping up as I walked through thinking about my gardens. It must be spring!!

As we finish this Lenten season and enter into Easter, remember it is just like the transition from winter into spring. During what seems to be the endless cold dark days of winter, we start to experience the new life that rises up from what we once were sure was dead. That is what the Easter season offers us as well, to seek and experience new life, new life in our congregation and new life for ourselves.

The grass is green across the hill, But yellow blooms the daffodil. It's sunshine on a little stalk, A friendly flower, I bet they talk...


Of little kids, too long inside They burst outdoors to play and hide. Tracking mud and bringing bugs. Look, there's footprints on the rug!

All donations should be empty and clean bottles and cans. The money will be used towards St. James Painting Project.




Military Prayer List
